What Are We Learning?

To begin to explore number bonds of ten.

How to Set up the Challenge

- Set up a party scene using a picnic blanket or table and set up ten spaces using cups, plates, party hats or anything else you may have that is suitable.
- Provide ten cuddly or small world toys for your child to play with in the party scene.
- Explain to your children that you are going to explore ways of making ten by exploring how many toys are at the tea party and how many spaces are left.
- Encourage your child to say their number bonds out loud while they play.
 For example, 'six and four makes ten.'

How to Get Your Child Thinking

- · How many toys are at your party?
- · How many empty seats have you got?
- · How many more toys could come to your party?
- Two toys have left the party, how many are at the party now?

Number Bonds of Ten



- Can you count how many toys can come to your party?
- There are five toys at your party. How many more can come to the party?
- How many have left the party to go home? How many are at the table now?
