

Maths

This half term we will be learning about multiplication and division.

In particular we will focus on:

- Recall and use multiplication and division facts for the 2, 5 and 10 multiplication tables, including recognising odd and even numbers
- Calculate mathematical statements for multiplication and division within the multiplication tables and write them using the multiplication ($\times$), division ($\div$) and equals ($=$)

Science

Living Things and Their Habitats

We will:

- compare the differences between things that are living, dead and things that have never been alive.
- identify that most living things live in habitats to which they are suited.
- describe how animals and plants depend on each other in their habitat.
- accurately describe a habitat and micro-habitat using evidence from my research.
- create a simple food chain for habitats in my local environment.
- describe how animals obtain their food from plants and other animals.

English

Our focus text will be 'The Enormous Crocodile' by Roald Dahl. We will develop our creative writing skills, learning more about adjectives and expanded noun phrases, write character descriptions and write a book review explaining and justifying our opinions. We will also carry out drama activities related to the book to deepen our understanding of the characters and their actions. We will then be researching and writing a non-fiction report about crocodiles. The children will identify the features of non-fiction texts (heading, sub-headings, present tense, photographs rather than drawings)

P.E. and Games:

Games lessons (provided by PE Specialists)

Indoor: We will be studying gymnastics, practicing changing direction and mastering different jumps to develop balance and coordination.

History/Geography

We will be learning about The United Kingdom, the four countries it is made up of and their flags.

We will then move onto learning about the Isle of Coll which is in the Western Hebrides of Scotland, We will use the Katie Morag stories to help us learn about Human and Physical geography.
