

Phase 6

Overview:

By end of phase children should know most of the common grapheme-phoneme correspondences
 (the written letters and spoken sounds). They will now be able to read hundreds of words.

Learn spelling patterns:

When the /o/ sound follows /w/
it is spelt with an 'a'
Was, wallet, want, wash, watch, wander

When /ur/ follows /w/ it is spelt 'or'

Word, worm, work, worship, worth

When the /or/ sound is before /l/
it is spelt with an 'a'

Call, always, ball

Suffixes

-ed

Using past tense, add suffix

Helphelped

Sort ...sorted

Live ...lived

Other suffixes:

s, es, ing, ful, er, est, ly, ment, ness, y
