# JORDANS SCHOOL CLASS NEWS



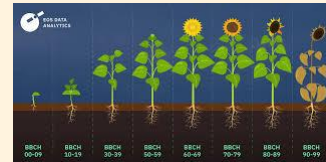
## Fox Class

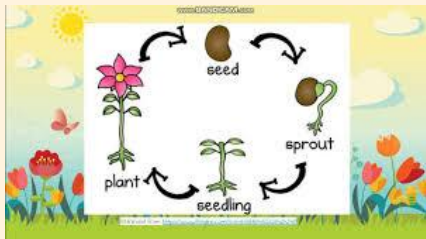
## Owl Class

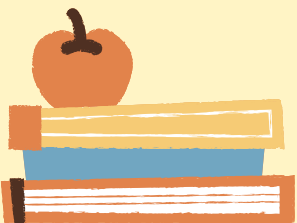

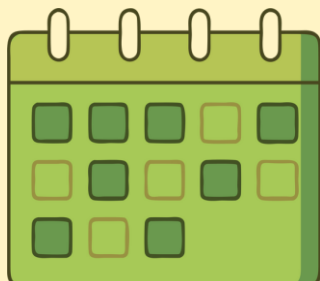

### Manor Farm Field North Biodiversity Project

*Saturday 28th February 10-1pm*

Our next volunteer work event on Manor Farm Field

We will be trimming 1/3 of the hedge along the path between Jordans and Seer Green, leaving the rest for cover and food sources for wildlife. There's also some raking to finish from when we mowed part of the field edges last year and we'll be taking a close look at the grassland to see if there are early indications that the meadow plants will be back this year!

Our work events are open to everyone with a range of tasks to suit all abilities. Drop in any time and stay for as long as you can. It's always helpful to know if you might be coming so we make sure there's enough cake!
