FOX CLASS



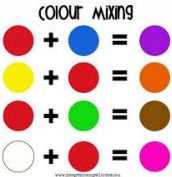

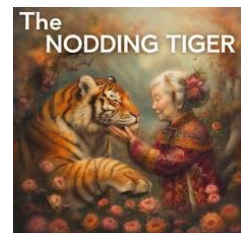
