Mr. Nick Hunt

Chair of Governors

Nick is a retired hospital director from the Board of the Royal Brompton & Harefield NHS Foundation Trust and has spent his working life in the NHS. He has a degree in English Language and Literature from Oxford University. He has 3 children – all state educated in Buckinghamshire – and is an experienced school governor and Chair of Governors. Nick joined Jordans Full Governing Body in September 2018.

Professor Ann Floyd

Ann has lived in Jordans for many years. Her three children were all pupils here; during that time she was a parent governor and then chair of the governing body for several years. She became a governor again in 2013 and is member of the Teaching and Learning Committee. Ann has a degree in mathematics, a PGCE and a doctorate in computer-assisted learning.
