Our School Council met this week to discuss the topic of Kindness and Friendships. Representatives from each class (school councillors) then reported back to everyone in a whole school assembly. Together, we shared points from the discussions and ideas.

1. What makes a good friend?

Listening to each other, playing with each other, doing kind things

A good friend is nice. A good friend is kind. A good friend lifts someone up when they have hurt themselves. A good friend shares. A good friend has courage. A good friend plays with each other. A good friend doesn't play rough with me. A good friend helps others. They make you happy!

Friends make each other happy and laugh together. Friends make up good games. They like the same games as you. They dance with you. They ask you to play with them. They are kind.

2. How can we help children who feel lonely?

Cheer them up, give them cuddle, ask them if they would like to be friends.

We can play with them. We can cheer them up. We can ask them to play with us. Be kind to everyone. Include others in our playing. Be kind.

We could say "Are you OK? Do you want to play with me?" They don't have to, but we give them a choice. You could ask them if they want a hug. You could ask them to sit with you.

3. What should we do if someone is being unkind? Why do you think people are sometimes unkind?

Tell the teacher, say no thank you, or say stop I don't like it.

Tell an adult. walk away from the unkind person. Say "stop doing that, it is not kind". Have courage. Take a deep breath to calm down.

People might be unkind because they don't like how they are doing something. Maybe they didn't have a good sleep. Perhaps they felt mad and angry.

Try to solve it yourself first. "Please can you stop. I don't like it" Tell an adult if they don't stop. Some children are too young to understand that they are being unkind. People might be unkind when they are cross with you. They might be unkind to you if you were unkind first.

4. How can we encourage everyone to follow the behaviour expectations of: Safe, Respect, Ready?

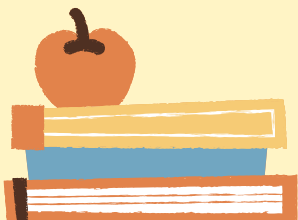

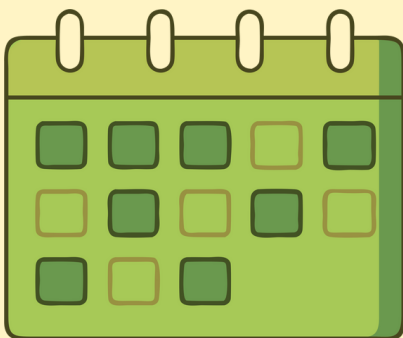

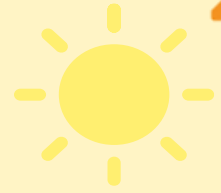

Jordans Biodiversity Project News

The cows are back in Manor Farm Field North! We've been working closely with the new licensee farmer of the south field over the past year to get cows back on the north field as part of the grassland management that supports a wildflower meadow. All sorts of farming conditions have got in the way of this until now, but here they are. They are a mixture of Red Devons and Murray Greys - 2.5 years old and possibly all pregnant! They will stay for a few weeks grazing on the post-hay cut growth which hopefully will mean that in the Spring the native flowering plants will have shorter grasses to compete with. Big thanks to Jonathon Chapman from Native Beef for his support and encouragement of the work we're doing to promote biodiversity on the field.

Over the summer months there has been a huge effort by our volunteers to water the whips planted earlier in the year. It was no small task - we had planted over 500 saplings at a distance that was beyond the reach of our hose! We're pleased to report that about 3/4 appear to have survived the successive heatwaves. Fingers crossed for Spring growth next year!

Next volunteer event - Saturday 15th November

10am - 1pm come along for as long as you can

We will be cutting back the bramble patches and managing the thistle growth. If the cows have left by then we have some additional wildflower plants and seeds for the grassland.

As always its helpful to know if you can make it so we make sure there is enough homemade cake! All welcome.
